There are three principal characteristics of Divine Grace.

First, IT IS ETERNAL. Grace was planned before it was exercised, purposed before it was imparted. "Who hath saved us, and called us, with a holy calling, not according to our works, but according to His own purpose and grace, which was given us in CHRIST JESUS BEFORE the world began," (2 Timothy 1:9).

Second, IT IS FREE for none did ever purchase it. "Being justified FREELY by His grace," (Romans 3:24).

Third, IT IS SOVEREIGN, because God exercises it toward and bestows it upon whom He pleases. "Even so might grace REIGN," (Romans 5:21). If grace the occupant of the throne is Sovereign. Hence, "the THRONE of grace," (Hebrews 4:16). "copied"

THE WORTHY PORTION OF THE BELIEVER (1 Samuel 1:4-5).

"And when the time was that Elkanah offered, he gave to Peninnah his wife, and to all her sons and her daughters, portions: But unto Hannah he gave a worthy portion; for he loved Hannah: but the Lord had shut up her womb"
